**SUPPORTING NAVAJO TRANSITIONAL ENERGY COMPANY'S CONTINUANCE OF OPERATIONS AT
THE NAVAJO MINE AND ITS ACQUISITION OF THE FOUR CORNERS POWER PLANT**

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act (26 N.N.C.), Chapter 1, Subchapter 1, Section 3 (A) the Round Rock Chapter Government, is a certified Chapter Organization, which elects a Delegate to the Navajo Nation Council. The Chapter is also listed as being certified at Part 1, Section 10, of 11 N.N.C., the "Navajo Nation Election Code; AND
2. Pursuant to the same "Act", Chapter 1, Subchapter 1, Section 1 (B-1), the Navajo Nation Council; delegates to our Chapter, governmental authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Law, including custom and tradition; AND
3. Section 1 (B-2) authorizes our Chapter, to improve Community decision making; allow us to excel and flourish; enable our Navajo Leaders to lead towards a prosperous future and improve the strength and sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Our Chapter is compelled to govern with responsibility and accountability to us, the Local Citizens; AND
4. Pursuant to the Federal "Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (P.L; 93-638), as amended, our Chapter Government, is entitled and supported to initiate plans and make recommendations, requests, and thus, determine the promotion, protection, and preservation of the general welfare of our Community People, as well as the Navajo Nation; AND
5. Pursuant to the Navajo Nation Council delegated the authority to Round Rock Chapter to make decisions over local matters to improve community decision-making, allow communities to excel and flourish, enable Navajo leaders to lead towards a prosperous future, and improve the strength and sovereignty of the Navajo Nation; AND
6. Navajo Transitional Energy Company (NTEC) was created by the Navajo Nation to develop and manage the Nation's conventional, alternative, and renewable energy resources; AND
7. NTEC is planning to extend the lifespan of the Navajo Mine by acquiring the Four Corners Power Plant; AND
8. NTEC is also planning to build, own, and operate additional solar and gas generation facilities; AND

9. NTEC's acquisition of the Four Corners Power Plant and development of additional generations facilities will support a clean energy economy on the Navajo Nation and responsible regional electric power generation; AND
10. The Navajo Mine and Four Corners Power Plant generate significant revenue to the Navajo Nation General Fund and sustain the Navajo economy through employment and vendor contracts; AND
11. Together, the Navajo Mine and Four Corners Power Plant provide hundreds of good paying jobs on the Navajo Nation, and over 85% of the employees at Navajo Mine and Four Corners Power Plant are Navajo; AND
12. The continued operations of the Navajo Mine and the acquisition of the Four Corners Power Plant will preserve existing jobs and allow NTEC to continue the community-based programs and support the Navajo People and communities, including scholarships, Community Benefit Funds grants, the Community Heating Resource Program, and other initiatives; AND
13. The Round Rock Chapter has reviewed the information regarding the Navajo mine and the Four Corners power Plant and recognizes the significance of its their positive contributions to Navajo People, the Navajo economy, and the Navajo Nation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Round Rock Chapter hereby supports the NTEC's efforts in continuing operations at the Navajo Mine, acquiring the Four Corners Power Plant, and the development of additional generations including solar and gas to develop and manage the energy resources of the Navajo Nation and create a sustainable energy economy for the Navajo People and the Navajo Nation.

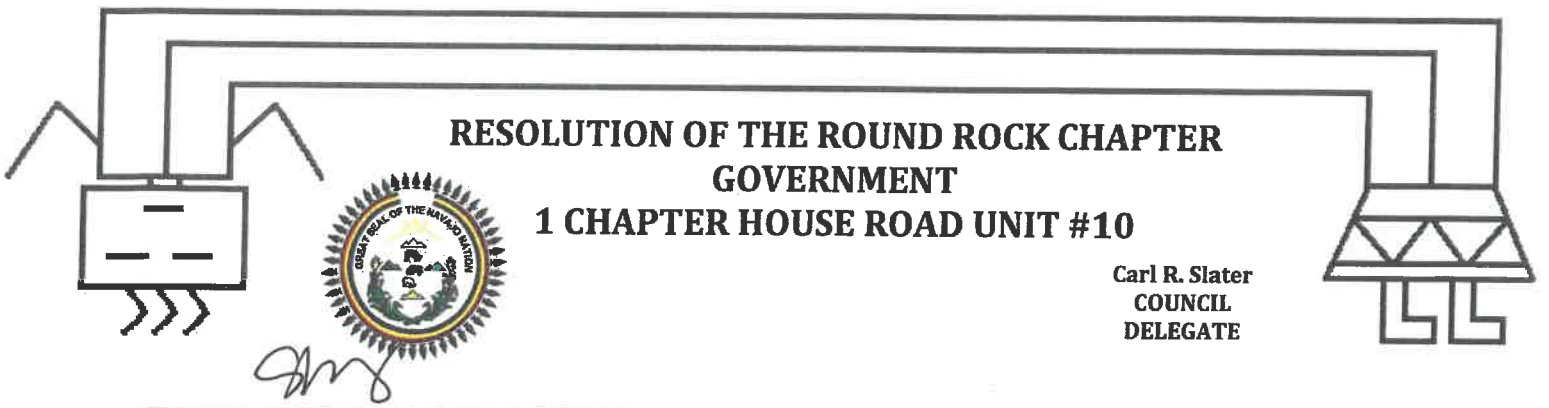
